Deciduous Branch (Fruited or Berried – foliage not required):

Cut specimen, one branch, max length 30"

Needled Evergreens: Cut specimen, one branch, max length 30"

Section A: FAIR OF FACE

Class 1: LOVER'S FARE Table Artistry Award

An informal Functional Table for two, to be staged on a table, 30"Round and 30"H Off-white undercloth to the floor provided.

Class 2: A FAIR MORNING Table Artistry Award

A Functional Breakfast Tray for One staged on a pedestal, 17"Square and 37"H Tray is provided by the exhibitor.

Class 3: PICNIC---FAIR WITH Table Artistry Award
NO CHANCE OF RAIN

An Exhibition Table staged on a platform, $20^{\prime\prime}H$ with a $20^{\prime\prime}D \times 30^{\prime\prime}W$ top, with an attached backboard $30^{\prime\prime}W \times 40^{\prime\prime}H$

Section B: FAIR ADVENTURE

Class 4: FAIR ELSA Designer's Choice Award
A low profile design fit for a Queen,
Staged on a box structure, 30"L x 19"W x 24"H

Class 5: IN PORT – FAIR HAVEN Designer's Choice Award
An Angular Design staged on a shelf, 20"W x 12"D.
Shelf to floor measures 46"

Class 6: LET'S GO TO THE FAIR Designer's Choice Award
A design inspired by splendor of autumn, staged on
a pedestal, 17"Square and 37"H

Required: 6 Classes, each with 4 entries.

General Rules

- 1. This is a Standard Flower Show staged according to the rules of the National Garden Club, Inc., using as its authority *Handbook For Flower Shows Revised 2017* and any changes published in *The National Gardener*.
- 2. An **exhibitors' meeting** will be held at the Fairgrounds in the Flower Barn, September 1, 2021 at 10 a.m.
- 3. **Entry dates** for Horticultural and Design are Friday, October 1, from 7-9 am and Wednesday, October 6, from 7-9 am <u>NOTE</u>: If one is entering both <u>Horticulture and Design, they MUST enter their Horticulture first.</u>
- 4. The NGC Standard **System of Awards** will be used for all competitive judging.
- 5. The use of artificial plant material, treating of fresh plant material, cut fruits and vegetables, and the use of menu food is **prohibited**. As this is a Flower Show, emphasis in Division I and Division II should be placed on using **fresh plant material**.
- 6. Wild collected plants of species listed by the Massachusetts Natural Heritage Program may not be exhibited in Standard Flower Shows of the Garden Club Federation of Massachusetts, Inc. or its member clubs. Cultivated plant material appearing on the list may be exhibited if the exhibitor provides a typed card noting that it has not been collected.
- 7. Plants listed in the Massachusetts **Prohibited Plant List** are not permitted in any Division. A current list may be found: www.Mass.govMassachusettsProhibitedPlantList
- 8. All entries from Day 1 must be **removed** by 9:30pm on Tuesday, October 5. Entries from Day 2 must be removed on Tuesday, October 12 between 9am and 2pm.
- 9. The Committee, The Garden Club of Massachusetts, Inc. and The Topsfield Fair will endeavor to protect all exhibits but cannot be responsible for loss or damage to the Exhibitor's property.

Horticulture Rules

- 1. The **NGC Exhibit Policies** are printed in the *Handbook* For Flower Shows Revised 2017, Chapter 6 and the *Horticulture Exhibiting & Judging Supplement* as the rules for a single species or container grown specimen.
- 2. To receive an NGC Top Exhibitor Award, the exhibitor must identify his/her entry by its binomial name or currently acceptable scientific designation.
- 3. Entry cards are to be filled out in advance if possible.
- 4. Specimens should not have foliage below waterline.
- 5. Exhibitors will submit entries in their own appropriately sized clean, clear, colorless glass containers. Wedging material (small-scale bubble wrap or plastic wrap) is permitted.
- 6. **Foliage plants** may flower but should be exhibited as foliage plants if they are grown for their leaves.
- 7. Specimens with a class designation in the schedule may not be entered in the 'Any Other Worthy' class.
- 8. The Horticulture Co-Chairs and/or the general show Chair are free to **subdivide a class** by color, form, size, cultivar, variety or other distinguishing characteristics.
- 9. Due to space limitations, exhibitors may be limited to a **maximum of four entries** at the discretion of the horticulture Co-Chairs. Exhibitors will be allowed to choose submitted entries if over the limit allowed.

Horticulture Awards

- The **Award of Horticulture Excellence** is offered to the highest scoring blue ribbon winner in the entire Horticulture Division for each entry date.
- The **Arboreal Award** is offered to the highest scoring blue ribbon winner in sections E and F.
- The **Award of Merit** is offered to the highest scoring blue ribbon winner in sections A, B and C.
- The *Grower's Choice Award* is offered to the highest scoring blue ribbon winner in section D.

Design Rules

- 1. Entries, the work of one exhibitor, are open to members of a Federated Garden Club.
- 2. All designs must be completed in the show area.
- 3. The exhibitor is required to conform to the stated description and limitations of the Design Type if named in the class.
- 4. An entry card listing all plant material used in the design must be given to and initialed by the Classification Chairman before the exhibitor leaves the show area.
- 5. "Rules for Design Types, Table Designs, and Table Appointments are printed in the HANDBOOK for FLOWER SHOWS, chapter 14."
- 6. Exhibitors are responsible for keeping their designs in good condition for the duration of the show.

Design Awards

The Standard System of Awarding is used and allows for

- First Place (one 90 points or above),
- Second Place (one 85 points or above),
- Third Place (one 80 points or above), and
- * Honorable Mention (one or more 75 points or above in each class). A design, if merited, may receive 90+ recognition.

Table Artistry Award

This may be awarded to a blue ribbon winner scoring 95 points or better in Functional and/or Exhibition Table designs.

Classes 1, 2, & 3 are eligible each entry day.

Designer's Choice Award

This may be awarded to a blue ribbon winner scoring 95 or more. Exhibitor has complete freedom to choose plant materials or other components for this award, within the National Garden Clubs, Inc. policies. Classes 4, 5, & 6 are eligible for this award each entry day.

Above awards are judged by the scale of points on page 130 in the *Handbook For Flower Shows Revised 2017*

Pauline D. Bowden Award

The designs receiving National Garden Clubs, Inc. top awards on each day will be evaluated using the scale of points for the Pauline D. Bowden Award. The award, an English Teapot, may be retained by the designer for one year. A certificate will be presented with the award. All classes are eligible.

Georgia McHugh Award

A plaque is given annually to the Novice with the highest point score in the Design Division at the Topsfield Fair. An exhibitor who has never won a blue ribbon in a standard flower show is considered a Novice.

All classes are eligible.
